
# Newsletter Friday 5th July 2024



Dear Parents and Carers,

This week, your children have been learning all about the environment following Crofty's Sustainability and Climate Curriculum, which all Crofty schools have been taking part in over a week this term. For each year group (Nursery to Year 6), a series of lessons have been identified as part of a progressive path to a defined outcome such as designing posters, creating web pages or recording a podcast. Each year group has a specific focus within sustainability linked to one of the United Nations Sustainability Goals:

Nursery and Reception were investigating plants and animals in our local and wider environment and learning about how we can take care of biodiversity.



Year 1 were learning about life below water, recognising the need to protect our aquatic environments and spent a morning rock pooling finding crabs, shrimps, blennies and even starfishes.

Year 2 were improving their knowledge of the impact of fumes from vehicles and how to encourage sustainable transport.

Year 3 went on a field trip to the stream that runs along the park to take water samples as part of their learning on clean water. They identified that the stream contains invertebrates but the quality of the water is too poor to contain fish.

Year 4 constructed solar ovens to melt smores as they learnt about clean energy.

Year 5 learnt all about responsible production of cars and how we can be agents of change to create a better future.

Year 6 broadened their knowledge of food miles and how producers are treated fairly.

The important aspect of this learning has been showing children that although some of the climate and environmental challenges may seem formidable, if we meet these challenges with determination and not with despair, we able to hope and be agents of change.

This week also saw the children take part in their own elections for school council members. We set up a polling station and the children were able to place their voting slip in a ballot box. It was pleasing to see that so many of our children wanted to put themselves forward as candidates and the results were extremely close with every child receiving votes.


KS1 Book of the Week

# This week we hear from Miss Mitchell in Nursery!

The children have been busy enjoying sustainability week. We explored the different homes found in trees and discovered the variety of animals that rely on them.

The children were fascinated to learn about the nests, webs, and burrows that provide shelter to many creatures. We talked about why trees are important to us and to animals and the importance of looking after our environment. Our week included an outdoor adventure in the school grounds where the children identified and

examined the trees we have. They enjoyed making rubbings on the bark to study the different textures and patterns. Inspired by what they learnt, the children painted pictures of the creatures that live in the trees and went on a litter pick around school.









# This week we hear from Mr Goward in Year 4!

This week it has been Sustainability Week at Porthleven Primary. This has led Swordfish Class into many debates, conversations and research sessions regarding renewable energy. We have



learnt about solar panels, hydroelectricity, geothermal and wind turbine energy – their positives and negatives, their costs, and what they can do for the environment. We've had two big projects this week as part of Sustainability, which have been to make smores in a solar oven (you'd be shocked at how successful these turned out to be!) and writing and performing a Renewable Energy rap. Inspired by Squid, an eco-rights rapper, Swordfish put together beats on their Chromebooks, then wrote lyrics to perform over the top of them. We've had some great verses this week – lots of thoughtful ideas about the potential of various renewable energy sources and an overall positive impression about our futures and what we can do as humans living on the earth to protect it. 
