
Porthleven Reading: In Class and Beyond November/December 2024

Teacher Reader Recommends.




Mr. Goward and Miss Maylam are in the spotlight this term.

when his own teacher shared their love for reading and now can often be found chatting about his latest read.


Miss Maylam loves sharing books with her own children and enjoys nothing more than talking with the children about their own books. She remembers so many books that is was hard for her to choose!
