As we approach the end of this first half-term, we want to take a moment to celebrate the wonderful progress made by our school community. This term has been all about growth, learning, and working together, and we are proud of what we have achieved so far.

Feel Safe and Belong

Our top priority is ensuring that every child feels safe and has a sense of belonging. We're thrilled that the recently refurbished classrooms have been so well-received by both students and staff. The new, modern layouts have created a welcoming, inclusive environment where children can feel comfortable, supported, and ready to thrive in their learning.

We Learn

This term has seen remarkable learning progress across all year groups! Children have embraced their new classroom routines and produced work to be proud of. We've introduced new Reading and Math fluency interventions based on precision teaching with flashcards, and the results have been good, with many children showing significant progress.

We are also proud to see more students stepping into leadership roles—whether it's as Librarians, School Councillors, House Captains, or Levy Listeners who support younger students at lunchtimes. These opportunities are helping foster responsibility and give our pupils a voice in shaping their school experience. Our School Councillors have been busy surveying their peers about playground improvements for KS2, and next half term they will present their recommendations to the Trust.

We Can

We continue to nurture a culture of "We Can," encouraging students to take ownership of their learning. In our recent INSET training, we focused on building 'Self-efficacy'—the belief that one can influence the outcomes in their own life. Many children still view school as something that happens to them rather than something they can actively shape. Some even feel limited by their past experiences. We are committed to challenging this mindset because we know that when children believe their actions can make a difference, they are far more likely to succeed.

Thank you to the parents who joined with us to celebrate harvest at St Bartholomew's Church last week. The children put on a great show of singing, poetry recital and reading blessings. Thank you also for your donations of food, which we delivered to the Helston and Lizard Food Bank with the help of a group of children to learn how the food is distributed.

Finally, I hope many of you have signed up for the parent / teacher meetings taking place the first week of next half term. I will be present each afternoon so please feel free to ask me any questions that you may have.

Year 4

This week, Swordfish Class completed their amazing drawing with scissors' projects, which involved crayoning backgrounds, covering them in black paint and washing-up liquid, followed by using scissors like pencils to slice through the black paint and create their images. The effect was bold, with the children's rainbow colours underneath shining through the black paint and adding a real impact to their creations.

We found the most successful results came from the crayon layer which had the most variety and consistency to its colouring – if there were any white gaps, the black paint didn't really come up as well. I hope the children might have a crack at this over half-term and see if they can create some more amazing 'drawing with scissors' pieces, that we could display for the whole class to see.

News

Year 1

The children in Seahorses class have been thoroughly enjoying their non-fiction writing about Autumn. We've had wonderful discussions about the changes in plants and animals during this season, as well as how humans feel in Autumn. This week, the children have been busy planning, and on Thursday, they will write their independent pieces, showcasing all the knowledge they've gathered.

In Maths, we have been exploring the **part-part-whole method**. The children have had the opportunity to engage with this concept practically before moving on to completing questions in their maths books. It's been great to see their confidence grow as they develop a deeper understanding of how numbers work.

As we approach the end of our current art project, the children have enjoyed studying the works of **Kandinsky** and **Bridget Riley**. Their enthusiasm for art has been wonderful to witness, and many of the children have expressed how much they love their art lessons to both Mrs Bird and myself. It's been a joy to see their creativity flourish!










It's been a long term, and the class has worked incredibly hard over the past 8 weeks. They've written exciting narrative pieces inspired by the book The Explorer and are currently working on biographies of people who interest them. We've just finished reading The Boy at the Back of the Class, which provided a fascinating insight into the life of a refugee boy and sparked many thought-provoking discussions. Year 5 maths has presented its challenges, but the children have stayed focused and made great progress. Please encourage everyone to keep practicing on Maths Whizz and TTR, as it reinforces the skills we're developing in class.

Our afternoons have been filled with a wide range of engaging topics. We explored the landscape around the UK's tallest mountains using a Geographical Information System (GIS) and built graphs to analyse the gestation periods of various animals. This hands-on learning has helped the class develop critical thinking and data interpretation skills across subjects.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

photos, videos and documents, as well as making voice and video calls. Its end-to-end encryption means messages can only be viewed by the sender and any recipients: not even WhatsApp can read them. Updates to its privacy policy in 2021 (involving sharing data with parent company Facebook) caused millions to leave the app, but the new policy was widely misinterpreted — it only related to WhatsApp's business features, not to personal messages.



WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

...TYPING...

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POTENTIAL CYBERBULLYING

Group chat and video calls are great for connecting with multiple people in WhatsApp, but there is always the potential for someone's feelings to be hurt by an unkind comment or joke. The 'only admins' feature gives the admin(s) of a group control over who can send messages. They can, for example, block people from posting in a chat, which could make a child feel excluded and upset.

SCAMS

Fraudsters occasionally send WhatsApp messages pretending to offer prizes – encouraging the user to click on a link to win. Other common scams involve warning someone that their WhatsApp subscription has run out (aiming to dupe them into disclosing payment details) or impersonating a friend or relative and asking for money to be transferred to help with an emergency.

DISAPPEARING MESSAGES

Users can set WhatsApp messages to disappear in 24 hours, 7 days or 90 days by default. Photos and videos can also be instructed to disappear after the recipient has viewed them. These files can't be saved or forwarded — so if your child was sent an inappropriate message, it would be difficult to prove any wrongdoing. However, the receiver can take a screenshot and save that as evidence.

ENABLING FAKE NEWS

WhatsApp has unfortunately been linked to accelerating the spread of dangerous rumours. In India in 2018, some outbreaks of mob violence appear to have been sparked by false allegations being shared on the app. WhatsApp itself took steps to prevent its users circulating hazardous theories and speculation in the early weeks of the Covid-19 pandemic.

CONTACT FROM STRANGERS

To start a WhatsApp chat, you only need the mobile number of the person you want to message (the other person also needs to have the app). WhatsApp can access the address book on someone's device and recognise which of their contacts also use the app. So if your child has ever given their phone number to someone they don't know, that person could use it to contact them via WhatsApp.

LOCATION SHARING

The 'live location' feature lets users share their current whereabouts, allowing friends to see their movements. WhatsApp describes it as a "simple and secure way to let people know where you are." It is a useful method for a young person to let loved ones know they're safe – but if they used it in a chat with people they don't know, they would be exposing their location to them, too.

Advice for Parents & Carers CUCK HERE BACK!

CREATE A SAFE PROFILE

Even though someone would need a child's phone number to add them as a contact, it's also worth altering a young person's profile settings to restrict who can see their photo and status. The options are 'everyone', 'my contacts' and 'nobody' – choosing one of the latter two ensures that your child's profile is better protected.



EXPLAIN ABOUT BLOCKING

If your child receives spam or offensive messages, calls or files from a contact, they should block them using 'settings' in the chat. Communication from a blocked contact won't show up on their device and stays undelivered. Blocking someone does not remove them from your child's contact list - so they also need to be deleted from the address book.

REPORT POTENTIAL SCAMS

Young people shouldn't engage with any message that looks suspicious or too good to be true. When your child receives a message from an unknown number for the first time, they'il be given the option to report it as spam. If the sender claims to be a friend or relative, call that person on their usual number to verify it realiy is them, or if it's someone trying to trick your child.

CHECK THE FACTS

right of the message. From
there, your child can launch a
Google search and decide for
themselves whether the
message was true or not.

If your child is in a group chat that is making them feel uncomfortable, or has been added to a group that they don't want to be part of, they can use WhatsApp's group settings to leave. If someone exits a group, the admin can add them back in once; if they leave a second time, it is permanent.

LEAVE A GROUP

THINK ABOUT LOCATION

If your child needs to use the 'live location' function to show you or one of their friends where they are, advise them to share their location only for as long as they need to. WhatsApp gives a range of 'live location' options, and your child should manually stop sharing their position as soon as it is no longer needed.

DELETE ACCIDENTAL MESSAGES

...TEXT

If your child posts a message they want to delete, WhatsApp allows the user seven minutes to erase a message. Tap and hold on the message, choose 'delete' and then 'delete for everyone.' However, it's important to remember that recipients may have seen (and taken a screenshot of) a message before it was deleted.

child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
