Nursery

Angelfish have had a busy and productive start to this half term. Our topic for the half term is "Everyday Superhero's". We began the topic by looking at how our important people help us at home and the ways in which they help us. The children confidently shared with each other the ways their grown ups help them at home. We learnt some of the delicious meals that were cooked for them. Last week we looked at the people who help them in the school environment. We had a visit from one of the school cooks who told us about her job and the way she helps in the school. She brought in the special protective gloves they must wear when using sharp knives and the children enjoyed trying these on. She also came with hairnets for the children to have and explaine<mark>d the purpose</mark> of these. This week we have begun learning about "Everyday superhero's" in our community. The children have learnt about how our rubbish is collected and taken to be recycled, how letters are collected and delivered, we even got to speak to the post lady when she came to deliver post to the school. We have looked at how builders help us and the huge range of things that can be built, the children had a go at designing and building their own buildings with a range of resources. We have finished the week learning about farmers and we were lucky enough to have a farmer come in with his tractor to talk about how he helps us by producing food. The children have continued to work hard during maths and phonics time and have become great at clapping the syllables in wo<mark>rds</mark> through a variety of games. Our new furniture in our home corner has been enjoyed and we have been cooked some fantastic and interesting meals by the children.

News

Last week, we had some furry visitors to class! Mrs Blight brought in her guineapig babies that were born on Christmas day and their mother Pancake. She talked to class about their birth, their habitat, their diet and how to care for them properly. Narwhals class have had a fascination with Guinea pigs since year 2 so it was lovely for us to be able to see some babies up close!

In science this half term, we are studying skeletons. We have learnt about the names of different bones that make up our skeletons and why we have them. Yesterday, we were measuring our femur bones in our legs and finding out if children with longer femurs were able to jump further. We investigated this by taking turns jumping and measuring the jumps. The children made sure this was a fair test by all jumping from the same point. We found that the length of the femur didn't always matter as one of the longest jumps was from someone with the shortest femur!

We are also busy in literacy writing our own adventure stories based on our work on 'The Secret of the Black Rock' with the children's characters sneaking away on exciting journeys to mountains, volcanoes and islands and trying to get home safely.



Should I keep my child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.	
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scabies	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
