


#### Year 1

Rainbowfish class have started the half term well, settling into their routines and embracing new challenges with enthusiasm and curiosity. They've been diving into phonics, writing and maths with great energy. This half term's topic, "Ready, Steady, Grow!" has sparked lots of excitement, with the children learning about the lifecycle of a butterfly in preparation for the arrival of their own class butterfly eggs next week. During busy learning time, they were inspired to create their own butterflies and chrysalis.

Our book of the week has been Jack and the Beanstalk. In maths, the children had fun making beanstalks and comparing them to see who could create the tallest one. On Tuesday, the children came back to find golden eggs hidden by the golden hen! They spent the week writing messages for one another and hiding them around the classroom. In addition, the children have been exploring time, learning about how long a minute is, and sequencing events. They even made jam or lemon curd sandwiches while discussing the steps—what to do first, next and last.

Next week, we're looking forward to reading Farmer Duck and learning to make the numbers 9 and 10. We're also excited to see many parents at our maths session on Tuesday to see how they can support their children with their maths at home!







#### Year 3

This week, Narwhals class began exploring our new writing unit on Ancient Egyptians and mummification for our explanation text. This links to our history topic, where we will learn about hieroglyphics and how the Ancient Egyptians relied on the River Nile. To start, we created our own timeline of key events from this fascinating period.

In our reading lessons, we started our new class reader, Anisha, Accidental Detective: Granny Trouble! by Serena Patel. As a sequel to a book the class read in Year 2, the children already have a great understanding of the interesting characters, and Anisha's adventure continues!

For French, we made a great start learning the words for pets. The class enjoyed playing interactive board games to practice the new vocabulary and they will carry out a class survey about animals next week. Attendance



On **Thursday, 6th March**, we are celebrating **World Book Day**, and we invite all children to come to school dressed as their favourite book character!





# Should I keep my child off school?



#### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.	
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scabies	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
